

Student Access

Teachers have many ways to give their students access.

1) **Single School Student Account for Research:**

Each school may have a student account that the teacher may allow the students to use for research projects, PowerPoint presentations, making their own movies with “editable” segments (use the Advanced Search to find editable segments), or telling a story with pictures. There only needs to be one student account per school unless the school is very large. The account may be used by any number of students simultaneously. It is recommended that it be used **at school and under the teacher’s direction**. It is not recommended for use at home. This account information should not be shared with anyone outside the school. Also, be sure students know that they may NOT post any resources on the internet. (Note: Be aware that there are videos on the site for grades K to 12 which means there may be videos that are not appropriate for elementary or middle schoolers. There may be a way to block 9-12 content from elementary student accounts. Look in Admin or ask Donna at dthompson@scetv.org)

- a. A Department Head or Account Admin on the Streamline site may go to My Admin, select a school and look for Add User.
- b. Select the type of user to be Student.
- c. You may wish to use the school name as the username (WoodElem or HerbertWood) and a color or mascot for the password. It will tell you if the username is already in use somewhere in the world.
- d. After the account is created, you may wish to block 9-12 content for elementary accounts.

2) **Writing Prompts, Quizzes & Assignments:**

- a. The teacher creates a writing prompt, quiz or an assignment under Builder Tools. Writing prompts and quizzes can be linked to any items in Streamline – video segments, articles, images, sounds, etc. The quiz might be an actual test or maybe just a review. Questions can be in random order for each student and the teacher can select to allow the students to see the graded quiz. The assignments can have links to writing prompts, quizzes, any asset in Streamline, and even web pages – of the teacher’s choice.
- b. Each Builder is automatically assigned a CODE at the end of the creation.
- c. The teacher can email a direct link to item or give the students this URL <http://assignments.discoveryeducation.com/> and the CODE.
- d. The student goes to the URL and puts in the code and their name.
- e. When completed, the student results are found in the teacher’s Streamline My Content with the drop down beside the builder and Student Results OR in My Classrooms under the Assign by CODE tab.

Or

My Classrooms

A teacher may use the My Classrooms feature for assigning whole classes or individual students resources to view. A Classroom is created and then students are added to the class. Assignments, Quizzes and Writing prompts are then linked to a classroom, a student, or several students. This is one way to differentiate learning for students. If you wish to import a whole list of students so the teacher does not have to individually create many student accounts, **share these directions with your IT person** to make this happen. The directions can also be found under Admin in Streamline.

- 3) Teachers may **download video segments, images and other assets** and allow students to view them on computers in the classroom, in a lab, or at home.
 - a. Burn the downloaded video segments to CD or save to USB flash drives to transport to all of the computers in the classroom or to a lab or to take home.
 - b. Save to a network drive that the students have access to and let the students pull the videos from that drive.
 - c. Save to a handheld video device for viewing individually with headphones.

- 4) You may link an Assignment, Quiz or Writing Prompt URL (found when creating one of these Builders) to an open teacher website since after going to that link, the student must put in a name to see the item.

- 5) Use your **imagination**. The assignment just has to be “teacher directed” and used for South Carolina classrooms.

- 6) You may NOT put the videos or other items from Streamline on an open web site. If the website is password protected and to be used by educators, parents and students within a South Carolina school, then it is permissible.
