



**SOUTH CAROLINA'S INTERPRETATION OF COPYRIGHT IN RELATION TO THE
Discovery Education (*unitedstreaming*[™]) INITIATIVE (not in legal terms)**

1. All teachers in South Carolina in K-12 institutions (including public and private), home schoolers, SC Technical College professors, professors at SC Universities/Colleges that teach our future teachers, and students in the K12 institutions (with a student account) are eligible to use all of the Discovery Education website at www.unitedstreaming.com free of charge from August 1, 2004 to July 31, 2009. (Sponsored and pre-paid for in partnership by ETV, SC Department of Education, and the K-12 Technology Initiative.)
2. Videos and Images may be downloaded/saved to places including hard drives, servers, digital optical media (such as CD's, DVD's), and USB flash drives, for educational use.

3. Videos may NOT be saved to VHS format. This converts the digital video to an analog format and that is not permitted.
4. Saved content must be marked to be deleted July 31, 2009. If the contract is renewed, then this date will be extended.
5. All content used from the site in lesson plans and projects (such as in PowerPoint) must have proper citation noting where the content came from.
6. At the direction of a teacher, students may use the content in projects for their school work. Content may not be shared with others outside of SC under this license.
7. The site may be used at school, at home, and anywhere there is Internet access if one has a valid SC account.

8. Videos marked as “Editable” may have pieces and parts used in student projects at the teacher’s direction. Don’t forget the proper citations.
9. Lesson Plans and Projects may have links to the content or actual items embedded in the projects. Don’t forget the proper citations.
10. If Lesson Plans and Projects are to be placed on a World Wide Web site, available to the world, then a link must be used, no content embedded.
11. If Lesson Plans and Projects have the content embedded, then they may be placed on an Intranet web site that is password protected so that usage is for folks in that school district.
12. Students may use the site at home or anywhere there is Internet access at the Teacher’s instruction. Ask for a Student Account, do not share teacher account logins.
13. Students do not need an account to take a quiz.
