Bobbi Kennedy Award – Video Submission Guidelines Suggested Length: 10 minutes or less

Your video should offer a meaningful look into who you are as an educator and how your teaching reflects the spirit of the Bobbi Kennedy Award.

Suggestions include, but are not limited to, the following:

- 1. Introduction (approx. 1 minute)
 - State your name, teaching role, school, and the grade level(s)/subject(s) you teach.
 - Share a brief insight into what inspires you as an educator
- 2. Teaching Philosophy (2–3 minutes)
 - Describe what meaningful, student-centered learning looks like in your classroom.
 - Explain how you integrate the arts, humanities, and community-building into your teaching practice
- 3. Creating Classroom Community (2–3 minutes)
 - Discuss how you foster connection, trust, and inclusion among your students.
 - Share specific examples of how you create a supportive and collaborative classroom environment
- 4. Creativity and Impact (2–3 minutes)
 - Explain how you use creative strategies to engage and inspire students.
 - Highlight a specific project, lesson, or classroom moment that illustrates your teaching philosophy in action
- 5. Vision for the Award (1–2 minutes)
 - Share how you would use the Bobbi Kennedy Award to enhance your students' learning experience
 - Describe the kind of project, initiative, or opportunity you would bring to life with this support
- 6. Closing Thoughts (up to 1 minute)
 - Reflect on why this award is meaningful to you
 - Offer any final thoughts or hopes for your students and your teaching journey
