Flash and Fancy: An Otter Adventure in the Waccamaw River

Grades K—2

In the book, *Flash and Fancy: An Otter Adventure in the Waccamaw River*, alliteration is used very often for impact. Alliteration is the when the first letter of a word is repeated by words close together. An example is “Peter Piper picked a pair of pickled peppers.” The letter P is repeated by the words that are close together.

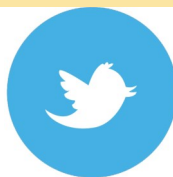
Use alliteration to complete the activities below:
